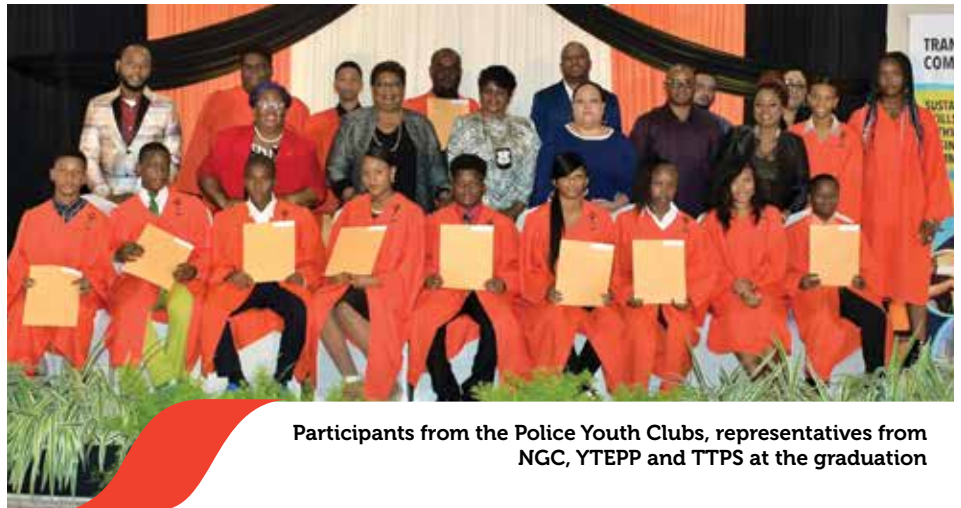
- Introduction to electrical installation

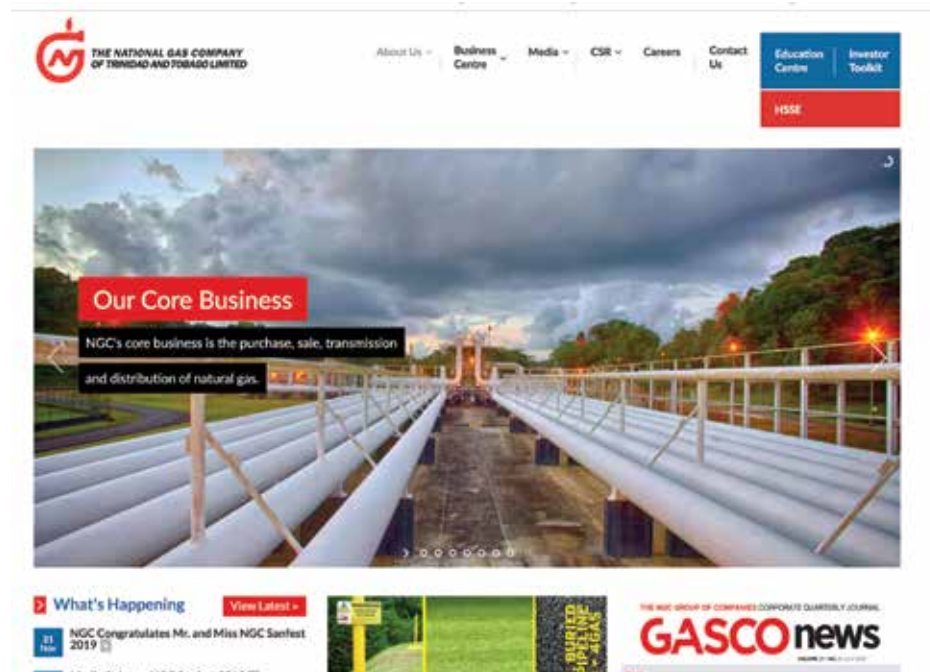

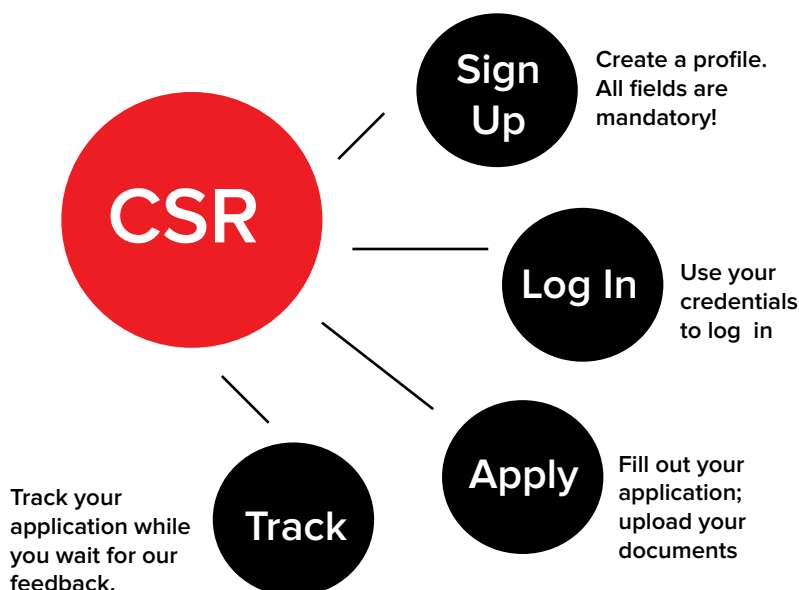

In 2019, NGC could not guess how much more talent was out there as a new instalment of NGC Sanfest rolled out. The winners of all competitions (see lists on pages 8 to 10) proved that without a doubt, this festival is helping to cultivate the creativity of our youth.

Creativity and class certainly shone bright at the Mr and Miss NGC Sanfest 2019 Teen Talent Competition in November. The eventual winners – Mr. Paris Coutain of St. Joseph Secondary School, and Miss Safiya Andrews of Holy Faith Convent, Penal – were well-deserved recipients of their respective titles. They were crowned at the Naparima Bowl, San Fernando.

The Mr and Miss NGC Sanfest is open to students between the ages of 13 and 19 years who are registered with secondary schools in Trinidad and Tobago. Part of their preparation also includes learning to be positive role models, respected leaders and engaging public speakers, while picking up tips on grooming and appearance along the way. The entrants also visited NGC and were given a motivational talk by a former Sanfest alum, Mr. Rondell Donowa.

Mr and Miss NGC Sanfest Teen Talent Competition is an important first step toward bringing the Arts into the mainstream of our economy. The preparation is not only aimed at refining talent, but targets the well-rounded development of participants into professional artistes – artistes who can represent themselves well, who can assume leadership of their respective fields, who can think critically and act responsibly, who can inspire their peers, who can build successful personal brands and promote Brand T&T to the world.

I obtained knowledge and skills from the workshops which encouraged me to be more positive and also support others who are chasing their dreams. I think every child should participate in Sanfest because we are all born winners; it will have a positive impact in their lives as it did mine".

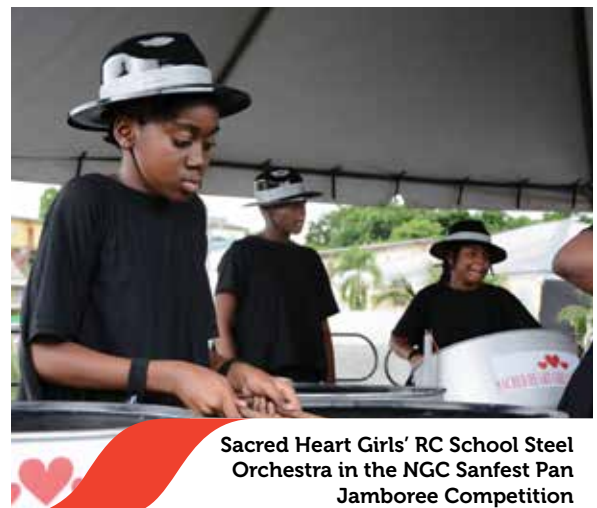

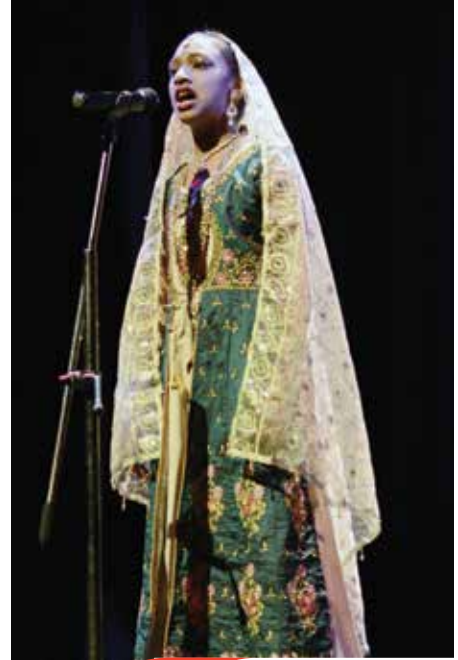

'Ti-Jean and His Brothers' – Showcasing Talent

NGC supported the production of the play *Ti-Jean and His Brothers*. The play is a Caribbean story written by Nobel Laureate the late Sir Derek Alton Walcott. Derek Walcott used a simple folk tale frame on which to weave his story with rich imagery and themes involving heaven, hell, colonialism and a nation's desire for independence. Three brothers bid goodbye to their mother and set off, one by one, to try to outwit the Devil. The play was directed by Wendell Manwarren and was held at the Queen's Hall from 26th to 29th September 2019. NGC supported students' attendance as the play is part of the CSEC syllabus. This is also part of our preservation of our arts and culture focus.



Beach Clean-Up

According to the World Ocean Network, "6.5 million tons of litter enter the world's oceans each year, and 50% is long-lasting plastic that will drift for hundreds of years before it is degraded". Ocean pollution has the potential to harm our environment, endangering: plants, animals, and humans.

To assist in combating the problem of ocean pollution, members of The NGC Group of Companies joined with the International Coastal Clean-up (ICC) to collect and document the trash littering the Station Beach coastline. ICC Day takes place annually on the third Saturday in September and is one of the largest co-ordinated one-day volunteer events in the world.

The data, which is collected from site co-ordinators and tabulated, is sent to Ocean Conservancy in the USA, which then creates an annual marine debris report.

Ms Ayanna Andrews, Administrative Assistant at NGC stated that "It was my first-time volunteering for a beach clean-up.
