PERSEVERANCE, SOLOMON HOCHOY HIGHWAY, CARLSEN FIELD AND LONGDENVILLE

The National Gas Company of Trinidad and Tobago Limited (NGC) is commencing construction works related to the "Replacement of the four inch (4") natural gas distribution pipeline, Perseverance to Longdenville"

The work will encompass (see below sketch) construction and replacement of pipeline using a combination of horizontal directional drilling (HDD) and open cut methods, and includes:

- Laying of 4-inch (102mm) diameter carbon steel buried natural gas pipeline extending from the 16-inch diameter pipeline west of Perseverance Road in the vicinity of the Caparo River to a regulator station east of the Solomon Hochoy Highway.
- Laying of 8-inch, (203mm) High Density Polyethylene buried natural gas pipeline from the regulator station in the vicinity of Seereeram Brothers (Solomon Hochoy Highway) to the east (Carlsen Field) and then to the north, ending at a new metering station at Trinidad Aggregate Products, Longdenville.

Construction Schedule

Construction activities will run from December 2011 to May 2012 at the following locations along the pipeline route:

- Perseverance to the Solomon Hochoy Highway
- The Solomon Hochoy Highway to Carlsen Field
- Carlsen Field to Longdenville

Construction at each area is forecasted to last approximately four weeks.

Construction Activities

These activities will include surveying, transportation of pipe and heavy equipment, stringing, trenching, welding, pipe laying, testing and site restoration.

NGC will advise the affected communities in advance by means of fliers and loudspeaker announcements about any activity that is likely to impact their daily activities.

NGC wishes to assure the public that every effort will be made to avoid inconvenience to you, including the minimization of dust and/or mud. Police or Traffic Wardens will be on hand to control the flow of traffic whenever necessary. We urge that instructions be followed to minimize any traffic disruptions. NGC field personnel will also be on hand to liaise with the public.

NGC will ensure that this project, as with all our operations, is conducted with safety as our highest priority.
