Natural Gas keeps our country moving forward.

NGC takes every precaution to protect its pipelines and facilities from being damaged. However, gas leaks may occur on rare occasions. Always trust your nose, eyes and ears to alert you. Do you smell rotten eggs? Do you see burnt vegetation near one of NGC's pipelines? Or, do you hear a hissing sound?

If you do, you must take the following steps immediately for everyone's safety:

- Warn others
- Leave the area ON FOOT right away
- Don't use cell phones or land lines until you are upwind of the area and no longer detect the smell
- Don't use matches, flashlights or anything that can spark
- Don't start vehicles
- Don't smoke
- Don't turn any lights on or off
- Call NGC's 24-hour Emergency Hotline 800-4427 and give details and your location
- Don't return to the area until you are given the all-clear by NGC and officials of the Fire Services

These simple rules will keep you safe.
